

#### **STRESS DAY**




#### **ORIENTATION DAY**



It was presented by Mr. AMEENABDULHAMEED, whose main objectives were to use questioning to enhance learning in the classroom, introduce the use of Socratic questions, Bloom's taxonomy and Christen Bury and Kelly Model to develop deeper forms of thinking, and to apply the key elements of effective questioning to develop student's critical thinking.




#### 'Career Planning and Emotional Intelligence'



### **Medical Screening Campaign**

The pharmacy community service committee coordinated with Sabeel Alshiffa company to conduct the campaign. A schedule was prepared for February- March 2023 to visit some companies and make health checkups for the workers and administrators. The checkups included blood pressure, glucose level, hearing and visual tests for five companies. A core objective of the campaign is to collect data to be used for research studies and educational purposes.

#### **Cancer Awareness Day**

On February 12th, the pharmacy community service committee and MACHS Central Community Service organized a campaign to reach the community titled 'Cancer Awareness Campaign'. The pharmacy community service committee coordinated with AGH at Alraka and Dammam to conduct the campaign. The awareness was done for three types of cancer: Breast Cancer, Lung cancer and Leukemia. In addition, ageneral medical examination for diabetes and hypertension was done for the audience by measuring their glucose level and blood pressure. On February 14th, MACHS Community Service Committee, in collaboration with FYD Faculty and Students, organized an activity at Al-Mana General Hospital in Dammam to raise public awareness about rare diseases and their impact on patients' lives.



The goal was to raise social awareness for International Rare Disease Day among the general public that may or may not know much about the rare diseases from which people suffer. The participants chose various topics such as Myasthenia Gravis, water allergy, sunsensitivity, Parkinson's disease, Moebius syndrome and many more to convey the information to the visitors using different strategies such as questionnaires, brochures, videos, posters, etc. They were successful in keeping the visitors engaged throughout their visit.
